


'The Park & Approaches', Buffalo NY, Olmsted Vaux & Co. 1865 - 1872

Frederick Law Olmsted Sr. and Calvert Vaux, the designers of the well-known Central Park in New Yark, first envisioned a park system tied together by 'Park Ways' while working in Buffalo NY in the late 1800's. See above.

The firm valued separation of different modes of travel for their 'Park Way' designs. See sketches to the right.
